




### Navy Ship Spending Totals \$2.8 Billion

Billions of dollars, FY 2014




## San Diego Ships Employ 23,000 Sailors

Total number of employees per class, FY 2015




# Navy Ships Bring \$4.5 Billion to San Diego Region

Billions of dollars, FY 2014




# Aircraft Carriers Generate \$500 Million Each for San Diego
